to build homes, communities and hope.

CONSTRUCTION

- In 2018, the Sisters Habitat volunteer construction team built two Energy Star certified homes which were purchased by the Ehr and Gray families. To date, Sisters Habitat has provided homeownership opportunities to 65 families.
- The Heart of Oregon–YouthBuild students worked with Habitat to build a third Energy Star home purchased by Silvia Ayala.
- Our Home Repair team completed a home weatherization project.
- 65 construction volunteers worked a total of 6,100 hours in 2018.
- Students from Sage Academy in Minnesota helped build the Ehr home during Spring Break.
- The 8th Annual Women Build Week was held in May of 2018. More than 50 women worked on landscaping and painting at the Gray and Ehr homes.
- A team of Habitat RV Care-a-Vanners helped side and paint the Gray home in August.
- Sisters Habitat hosted the inaugural Build Oregon event with Habitat Oregon.





VOLUNTEERS

- 43 new volunteers joined Sisters Habitat this year.
- Approximately 240 volunteers helped Habitat in the Thrift Store, ReStore, on the construction sites and served on the board and on various committees.
- The 10th Annual Volunteer Appreciation Picnic was held in August, at which two more of our volunteers were recognized for contributing more than 1,000 hours of service to Sisters Habitat. There are now a total of 102 volunteers in the 1,000 Hour Club.
- Nan Daschel was honored with the President's Lifetime Service Award for serving more than 4,000 hours. To date, eight volunteers have earned this distinction.
- 95 volunteers were honored with President's awards for volunteering 100 or more hours.
- Long-time Thrift Store Volunteer, Eula Curtis passed away in April. She was a member of the 1,000 hour club.

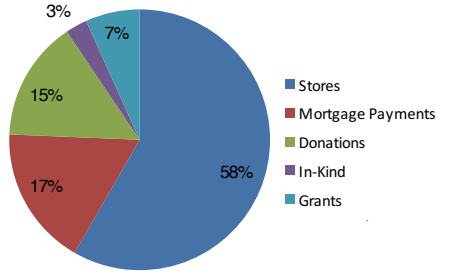


MONEY MATTERS

- 84 cents of every dollar raised for Sisters Habitat went toward our programs.
- Habitat Homeowners paid \$194,000 in mortgage payments which will go toward building more homes.
- Habitat Homeowners paid \$96,054 in property taxes to Deschutes County.
- \$167,000 was donated by individuals including six monthly donors.
- A \$100,000 matching donation was made by an anonymous donor. Funds will be used for the first two homes at the ClearPine neighborhood.
- \$19,600 was received from the Housing and Urban Development, Self-Help Opportunity Program (SHOP) toward infrastructure and System Development Charges (SDCS).
- A \$5,000 grant was received from Lowes to help purchase materials for Women Build Week.
- The St. Charles Foundation provided a \$2,000 sponsorship for the Ayala home.

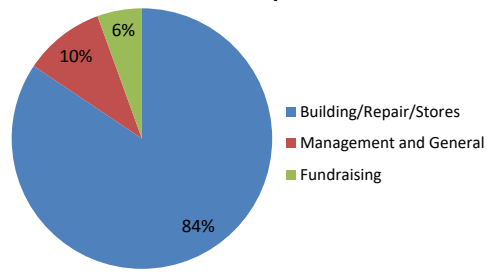
Income FY 2018

MONEY MATTERS - CONTINUED

- The Oregon Association of Realtors provided a \$5,000 grant toward the Heart of Oregon–YouthBuild home.
- US Bank provided a \$2,500 grant for the Heart of Oregon–YouthBuild home.
- \$390,000 was awarded from Oregon Housing and Community Services to purchase property in the ClearPine neighborhood.
- Received \$6,000 from Central Oregon Health Council to help with land partition costs.
- The 12th Annual Gingerbread Trail raised more than \$1,750.
- Sisters Habitat tithed \$32,750 to Habitat for Humanity Cambodia, Habitat for Humanity Ivory Coast, Habitat for Humanity Romania and Vietnam Big Build. To date, Sisters Habitat has provided funding for 115 homes abroad.



SISTERS STORES

With the generous support of previous owners Tim and Deanna Muir, Sisters Habitat purchased the former Sisters Drug & Gift Building. Volunteers and staff are working hard to get the space ready for the Thrift Store to relocate in early Spring 2019. A decision will be made regarding a permanent home for the ReStore, later in the year.



ReStore Manager Robin Tawney and Assistant Manager Gar Slenning both retired. Davey Alexander was hired as new ReStore Manager, along with Amy Shultz and Kathy Taylor as ReStore assistants. Josie Newport was hired as the new Store Volunteer Coordinator.

Thrift Store

- Raised \$317,000 and contributed \$191,000 to Sisters Habitat.
- Hosted the 19th Annual Christmas Shopping Day for 20 low-income students.
- 87 people volunteered 9,248 hours in the Thrift Store.
- Contributed clothing and household items to 29 families in need referred by the Family Access Network (FAN).
- Donated 217,123 pounds (5,428 bags) of surplus clothing to the Opportunity Foundation and Heart of Oregon Corps thrift stores.



ReStore

- Raised \$346,000 and contributed \$133,000 to Sisters Habitat.
- 72 people volunteered over 5,627 hours in the ReStore.
- Received \$42,871 from DEQ Materials Management Grant for the purchase of a new box truck and equipment for the ReStore.
- Kept one million pounds of recyclables out of the landfill.
- Contributed items to nine families in need as referred by the Family Access Network (FAN).
- Gave more than 64 sleeping bags and tents to homeless people and collected items for the Sisters Cold Weather Shelter.
